<p>Emmanuel Remy Columbus City Council</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When you call bulk pickup, you have to call it in and give a rough estimate of how much garbage there is. • There is a policy for panhandlers to fine them. There is not enough people to enforce this. Do not give panhandlers money. You can give them a resource card and treat them with respect. Make sure that you do report aggressive panhandlers. • The car impound lot now has new leadership and they are getting rid of cards • The Columbus City Council did cottify many procedures for the police force. This includes the use of helicopters and crowd control and protests. • There will still be a mounted patrol section of the Police Department • The tax abatements for developers to build affordable housing has begun. • AEP did not communicate with the city during the power outage in June. You can file a complaint on the PUCO website. • There is a grant program available for organizations if they plan a cleanup. They will give out \$500 to those organizations. • National Night Out grants are available.

Over 1330 people have used this service. • First session is usually around 60-90 minutes. • They help people get a safe and affordable bank account and reduce debt. • You will be able to use resources given to you through the program • The councilors are highly trained • They are also able to secure translators for training. • Councilors have flexible schedules
