Police (Officer Phillips)	Summary of recent crimes in the area. Answered questions about whether pepper spray is legal (yes), whether caging wild sparrows is legal (not sure) and what to do when cars in driveways are blocking the sidewalk (call non-emergency and/or 311)			
City Attorney (Steve Dunbar, Property Action Team Zone 1)	 Apartments north of Morse between Karl and Cleveland – some are vacant and under court order. Some owners want to do the right thing but need incentive. Others make promises to change but don't. (Tall Oaks, Winterwood, Winterwood Gardens) Answered question about ABVI hotel on Sinclair Road – they are being fined and there is a hearing coming up attempting to move it into receivership. There's a flurry of activity and attempts to improve but seems to be a pattern where real change is not likely. 			
Friends of Alum Creek & Consider Biking (David Roseman)	 David Roseman south side of 161 the construction is being completed to add a multi-use path where the ditch used to be. Parkville is currently closed as they install the roundabout there. Columbus City Council is amending the city code on "weeds" to better accommodate native plant gardening. 12-inch high plants will no longer be a violation as long as it's a native or pollinator plant. It can be 100% of your property as long as it is "well-maintained." The new language is very simple and brief. Has not been approved by the council yet. Councilmember Wyche is leading the change. There is a subsection that deals with the sight lines so it doesn't pose a hazard to traffic.

City of Columbus Community Liaison (Devin Deal)	 The Department of Neighborhoods has hired a new assistant director and a new neighborhood administrator. Both new leaders are highly qualified and have robust experience with the city. Office on Aging – Thurs July 24 – Clippers tickets \$5 and lunch provided for residents 65 and older. 614-462-5250 to order tickets. Devin sent information on two grants available and emphasized the grant for a youth-led environmental project.

Roundtable Code Enforcement Overview Danielle Weber, Supervisor Code Enforcement	 Private property, housing code, graphic code, nuisance violations, noise, etc. We've had a lot of complaints about semi parking. We can't do anything about parking on a public street (that's police) but if it's on private property such as the vacant lot on Morse Road. In that case we received permission to tow semis and their loads. We've been doing a lot of responses to weeds and high grass. If someone calls 311 and it's a code issue, we have 7-10 days to get a code enforcement officer there. The property owner has a certain timeframe to comply. We can extend if we see evidence they are working. If they are not working with us, we prepare a court packet and this gets referred to the city attorney's office for prosecution. Each code officer is balancing 150 cases, approximately. Questions about digital animated sign for Sirens – that goes to a specialist and Danielle was not aware of the status. Can code do something about items that can't be seen from the street? Yes, if a neighbor will let us onto their property to look, but then that neighbor will possibly be subject to any violations the officer sees at their house. If a car is covered in a driveway but hasn't moved, is that a violation? If we can't observe that the tires are flat or it's damaged or the license is expired, we can't do anything. If you put your name on a complaint, the person can request your name via a Freedom of Information Act Request. You can report anonymously.

Independence Day Parade Committee northlandparade.org	 8:30a lineup begins for 4th of July Parade next month on Friday July 4. Alicia Ward will be our Grand Marshal! Hadler will be the Diamond Sponsor this year for \$3,000. Howard Hanna also became a \$500 sponsor. We are at 45 to 50 percent of our fundraising budget. We also need more volunteers. We are listed on the City of Columbus Volunteer Hub, thanks to Ambrosia at Woodward Park Rec Center. NorthlandParade.org is active and people can apply and pay online.
Development Committee Dave Paul, Chair	 Dave Paul reported on the following: Dave created a map that represents the expansion we voted on last month. The yellow shows the new area (plus some existing areas such as Lee-Ulry) and shows the Rocky-Fork Blacklick Accord area in blue. The red area shows Northland Plan I and II areas. As soon as Dave submits the map to the city, they will update their processes almost immediately. Neighborhoods that want to join NCC simply have to form a civic organization first and then apply to join. CASE ONE – We had about 75 residents show up to oppose a proposal to rezone a parcel on Central College for an apartment complex. We recommended disapproval unanimously due to concerns about traffic, the adjacent city park, and density. CASE TWO through FOUR all related to cases that came up due to the new zoning code, which specifies different setbacks, screening of dumpsters, transparency of the building façade, etc. The idea is to create a more human-centered, walkable approach to city design and sometimes the rules are difficult to comply with. Our committee supported all three applications for variance.
